

LOOK TO THE HERITAGE WITH ZEAL, CARE AND CONCERN





## About Studio Sarasá


In 1956, was founded the Atelier Artistic Gerardo Sarasá, the first company of arts and restoration of Sarasá family in Brazil. It has received the name of an important reference in artistic production, crafts of tiles and stained glass, Gerardo Martin Sarasá. Since the 70's, is dedicated to conservation projects and restoration of Brazilian heritage.


